There are about 80,000 words in the Quran but the actual words are only around 2000!!!! This could also be termed as one of the many miracles of the Quran. Accordingly, if a reader decides to learn only 10 new words every day, he can understand the basic message of the Quran within a period of seven months! So it is indeed very easy to understand the Quran, provided one is willing to learn it. This word-for-word translation may not be considered as an addition to the existing translations, but an attempt to equip the reader to understand the revelation directly from the Arabic text; thus it will Insha-Allah be a very useful tool for those who are willing to study the Quran and try to understand it. A beginner can bear in mind the meanings of each Arabic word provided right below it. Since many words are repeated in the Quran, the student will find for himself that within a few months of regular study, he is indeed able to understand the Quran through the text itself. It may also be pointed out that a beginner does not have to, in the start itself, be worried about learning extensive grammar or how to speak the Arabic language. In fact, one has to develop vocabulary before learning grammar for the following reasons: \* A child first learns words and then starts linking them together. We speak our mother tongue fluently without ever learning the grammatical rules. That is to say, we learn it by repeatedly listening to the words. \* Learning extensive grammar before improving vocabulary is like putting the cart before the horse. Or it is like learning different styles of swimming by moving hands in the air inside a swimming pool without water. One has to fill the swimming pool with water (i.e., increase vocabulary) and then learn to swim (i.e., to connect the words with grammatical rules).

There are about 77,500 words in the Quran which are reduced to around 15,000 words after excluding repetitions and further reduced to less than 5000 Basic Words after removing different conjugations of the same word. The words in this compilation is the Complete List of these Basic Words. This book is Unique in the sense that it is the First and the Only Compilation available which has words similar in meanings grouped together in Root categories with Pronunciations, Frequencies, clear demarcation of Verbs, Proper Nouns and Names of The God given in one list. The main focus of the book is to Memorize the meanings of the Words of Quran in an easy and quickest possible way. However it can be used as a Reference too. The layout of the book has been kept bright and vibrant with lots of color highlights which aid in better retention of the words.

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“Explanation of Quran Words Word by Word” is completely Arabic Book. It is a comprehensive book that explains all the words of the Holy Quran. In spite of the multiplicity of Holy Quran explanation Books, but this book is the only book that includes an explanation of each and every word without any exception. The words have been arranged vertically in order to develop the explanation of each word next to it, and thus becomes a book to read the Holy Quran, and to review the Explanation of every word at the same time, which relieves the burden on the reader by using one book instead of two books. Perhaps the inclusion of the book to all the explanation of all words, whether their meanings look difficult or easy, relaxes the reader when he reads in a comprehensive and integrated book, in particular that there are a lot of words that may seem to have a clear explanation to a lot of readers, but the readers will become surprised when they discover that the explanation of these words are contrary to their expectations. It is worth mentioning that the text of Quranic words in this book does not tolerate any misspelling possibility, because they have been derived from the electronic othmani version of the Holy Quran issued by King Fahd Complex in Medina Monawwarah. The book consists of three volumes, and each volume consists of about ten parts(Ajza’). The pages of the book have been arranged so that the starting of every part(Joz’) is always at the top of the page, and the name of the sura and part(Joz’) number at the top of each page. On the other hand, the verset(Aya) number was developed to the right of each word. For further convenience of the reader every other verset(Aya) has been shaded to distinguish between the different successive verset(Ayat) during reading. It is worth noting that reading a page starts from the top of the right column down to the bottom and then the top of the left column down to the bottom, and so on. The contents of each Volume is available at the end of the book, where it is easy to find the page number for the beginning of each Surah.

If you master these word lists, you need to know only 2 out of 9 in each line of the Holy Qur’an (based on statistical average using a typical Qur’anic Mushaf containing 600 pages, with each page having 15 lines).The words given in this booklet account for 82.6% (64,282) of the total number of words (approx. 77,800) of the Holy Qur’an. The words listed in the first six pages occur very frequently. Some of them occur in combination with each other. They constitute a whopping 41.5% (32,263) of the totalnumber of words.The next pages, from 7-14 (noun pages) and 15-33 (verb pages), show the number of times that the noun or the verb in its various forms occur in the Holy Qur’an. For each verb, the past tense, the imperfect tense, the imperative, the active participle and the verbal noun are provided. It is assumed that based on this information, you can reproduce the whole verb table, samples of which are provided at the end of this booklet.

To understand the Qur’an, it is necessary that one should know the translation of every word of the Verses. It is very difficult to understand the Qur’an without knowledge of the meanings of the Arabic words. Therefore, to overcome this difficulty and to convey to the people the accurate meaning of the Qur’anic Verses, we are producing the word-for-word translation of the meanings of the Noble Qur’an. since mere word-for-word translation itself does not lead to complete understanding, we have produced the idiomatic translation also in order to allow the readers to see the word-for-word translation of the Arabic Verses along with the idiomatic one on the same page. All the present English translations of the meanings of the Qur’an are idiomatic. Such translations are not designed to help the reader learn the meanings of each Arabic word. Therefore, the readers and reciters simply proceed forward without ‘knowledge of the Arabic vocabulary used in the Verses. But when one knows the Meanings of each Arabic word of the Verse, then whether he himself recites the Qur’an, or listens to some other’s recitation, he gets the pleasure of understanding it.
